

# TITLE IX

---

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 ("Title IX") is a federal law that prohibits sex-based discrimination in educational programs and activities, including athletic programs. No person shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any educational program or activity operated by the May Institute. Title IX and its implementing regulation at 34 C.F.R. Part 106 protect all participants in the Institute's educational programs and activities, including students, parents, employees, and job applicants. May Institute does not discriminate on the basis of sex.

## **Who is the Title IX coordinator?**

May Institute has a Title IX Coordinator who oversees the Institute's compliance with Title IX requirements and promotes sex equity in Institute programs.
